### **2009 Nahele Dry Forest Workshops**

#### I. Tricks of the trade - Planting techniques & field watering

**techniques** – Bill Garnett (Wiliwili Native Plants), Mike Donoho (Pu'u Wa'awa'a Coordinator), and Paul Higashino (Kaho'olawe Restoration Manager)

Deep watering, double dibbles, mulching with vegetation and rocks, shading, catchment/watering strategies and more.

To be held at the Uhiuhi enclosure/makai Pu'u Wa'awa'a. The Uhiuhi enclosure is on the makai side of Highway 190, just on the Kona-side of the 24 mile marker. Please use caution when approaching the small pull-off. Even though the speed limit is now 50, it's still a raceway. The gate will be open to the smaller enclosure to ensure that there will be enough parking.

# II. Pests & diseases of native Hawaiian plants - Scot Nelson (CTAHR), JB Friday (CTAHR), Walter Nagamine (Hawai'i Department of Agriculture) and others

This hands-on workshop will cover plant diseases caused by plant pathogens such as fungi, bacteria, nematodes, etc. It will also cover insect pests. There will be diseased and pest-infested plants for participants to examine, and information about how to care for sick plants and how they respond to pesticides.
