
Seed Variety Selection Tool for the Hawaiian Islands

Plant Hardiness Zone Map for Hawai'i County (Hawai'i Island)

SOUTH KONA ZONE: The southwest portion of Hawai'i Island experiences a different rainfall pattern than the rest of the Hawaiian Islands. This zone is typically drier in the winter and wetter in the summer. If you live within the South Kona Zone (indicated on the map), you may wish to plant in the opposite season from others in the same zone who are not in South Kona.




